ritical Hydration Season is Beginning

e're entering nnual cycle of adjustment - blood thins out. at CRAMPS, Exhaustion, STROKE - pay attention to this progression aware of fluid intake- WATER, juice, etc. Avoid the Red Bull! oper rest cycle more important than ever; avoid sleep deficit.

Maintain Worker Free Space

cent incident where a worker was struck by shovel of hot asphalt: Remem ave a clear space around people working

- is magnified when they are using power tools such as chain saws, chop sa lers, etc. Even a hammer can cause shrapnel - and mind that back swing!
- e goes when around any vehicles, on the jobsite or elsewhere. People right to vehicles are hard to see and non-commercial vehicles don't have back s.
- t walk in between vehicles when one is in the process of getting ready to e. Driver may put the vehicle in reverse when you're expecting forward, a versa.

hain Saw / Chop Saw Safety

Actually, this applies to ANY kind of power tool.

- Swinging a sledge hammer can generate a pretty good amount of percussive force, but the damage is likely to be in the 'blunt force trauma' category.
- Anything with a rotating blade can result in what's called an 'avulsion aceration.' That can be ugly.
- n other words, there are safety practices for just about everything In order to extend our time on earth to its fullest measure.... Adhere to the safety practices.
- Applies to YOU and Contractors always practice defensive measures.
- Cost of accidents is astronomical. Do all we can to avoid.
