


July Safety Info

HEAT, HOT AND HOTTER – JULY & AUGUST



- Buy more watermelon, peaches, strawberries
- Drink more water, Gator-ade, squincher, lemonade, etc. Think electrolyte replacement!
- Eat Less heavy meals; more salad, less fat, skip the fries, have a tomato, fruit, corn, hydrating veggies
- Water cooler & ice bucket challenge <u>drinking liquid that is too cold is not good</u>
- Cool to room temp is best for assimilation otherwise our body has to work harder to absorb H2O
- High heat can accelerate fatigue. Get adequate rest cycle; REM sleep

Defensive Driving Reminders: FIVE KEYS to Survival

- 4 Second Following Distance Number One defensive practice
- Remember the 5 Keys Aim High, Get the Big Picture, Make Sure They SEE YOU, Keep Eyes Moving, Leave an OUT
- All speeds, all situations, day & night
- Intersections, parking lots, driveways, residential, interstate ramps
- Safe Backing VOSH Reverse Signal LOOK before backing, use a Spotter
- Remember: most drivers are not attending Defensive Driving class.
 YOU have the edge of knowledge and preparedness

PPE – POISON PLANT- TICK



- Cooling bandanas work great for those working in the sun
- Pre- and post-exposure poison ivy treatments use fels naphthalene soap to remove oil
- Giant Hogweed toxic and highly irritating identify and avoid, report growth for removal
- Disposable gloves high grip evaluate for certain applications; carry a few pair for incidental use
- Sun shade for hard hat; use nape protectors to keep sun off

HOT WEATHER DEFENSIVE DRIVING



- High Heat is tough on vehicles. Tires, battery, electrical systems, hot steel and glass, etc.
- High temp on road surface may affect tires. Check pressure and tread-wear patter
- Avoid road rage situations; use defensive positioning <u>use the 5 keys of defensive driving</u>
- Make sure they see you! Wear your vest; stay visible; stay in defensive, protected position
- Semitrailers if you hear a slapping noise from tires, back off. The tread is separating and indicates a failure is likely. Stay well away the tire carcass can cause a wreck.
