Incident Investigation Checklist

Ask why? Use the categories below to get started. Keep asking why until you find the source of the incident.

Equipment		Employee
□ Sweeper □ Backpack Blower	Did the equipment contribute to the incident	Are there written procedures for the task to be accomplished, if so, was the employee provided training?
☐ Liftgate	through a failure, lack of feature or lack of maintenance?	Is the employee physically capable of carrying out the tasks?
□ Forklift □ Tools		Did the employee wear the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)?
□ OtherComments on equipment:	-	Is enough time allowed for workers to do their tasks correctly and safely so that they aren't tempted to take shortcuts?
